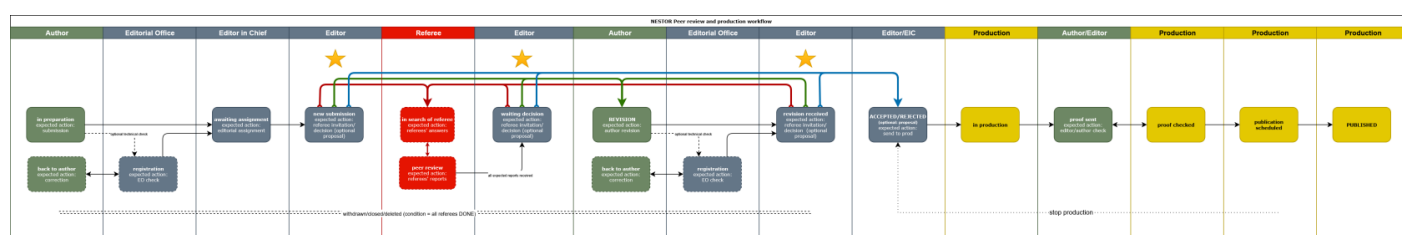


Workflow summary

The workflow is divided into statuses, an article will go through a series of statuses to reach a final decision.

Below is a diagram of the Nestor workflow. For each status, Nestor expects an action from the indicated user, and use [the due date](#) to calculate delays.

Blue boxes represent editorial statuses: they will appear in editors' to-do list and require your attention!



Some parts of the workflow are highly configurable, namely:

- [the technical check](#) (status; Registration / RV registration)
- [editors' assignments](#) (status: awaiting assignment)
- [the peer review system](#) (status; in search of referee / peer review)
- [the decision workflow](#) (new submission / waiting decision / revision received)

Configuring these usually involves:

- Checking the workflow options in the [article type](#), to ensure the workflow is enabled
- Checking the [editors' rights](#) according to their profile, to ensure at least one editor can handle the workflow
- Checking relevant [mail templates](#) triggered by workflow events, to ensure the letters format match your journal needs

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
